

## FUNDING

SOUCS is funded in large part by the Office of Special Education Programs at the U.S. Department of Education. From 2008–2023, over the 15 years of Unified Champion Schools programming, \$195 million in funding has been received from OSEP. Special Olympics state Programs, through their fundraising efforts, have contributed \$187 million in cash and VIK.
